Recipe of the Month

Crockpot Cranberry Apple Stuffing

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- I. In crockpot, mix together the eggs, chicken stock, and 3 tablespoons of melted butter
- 2. Add in bread cubes, celery, apples, and stir until bread crumbs are completely coated
- 3. Stir in dried cranberries, sage, thyme, and parsley
- Slice the last tablespoon of butter into 3 thinner slices and place on top of the stuffing
- 5. Cook in the crockpot on high heat for I hour
- 6. Stir with fork when finished

Ingredients

- * 10 ounces dried bread crumbs
- * 2 stalks of chopped celery
- * I chopped apple
- * 1/2 cup dried cranberries
- * 1/2 tablespoon sage
- * $\frac{1}{2}$ tablespoon thyme
- * I tablespoon parsley
- * 2 cups low sodium chicken stock

Serves 6

- * 4 tablespoons unsalted butter
- * 2 eggs

Talk to Your Insurance Company



Begin by contacting your insurance company. Find out what you are allowed under Durable Medical Equipment and talk to a case manager about having an iPad covered through your DME (be sure to ask for a case manager to be assigned to you because they have more deciding power than customer service).



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Ask Your School

Another place to go to for an iPad is your child's school district. If you feel that your child would greatly benefit from the use of an iPad in school, then these are the people who should be funding the purchase. Of course, the iPad would then be technically school property so you'll want to make sure that they will allow your child to use the iPad outside of the classroom, but that can usually be arranged.



There are many places that specialize in getting funds to children who need them. Applying for an iPad through these organizations is not a guarantee, but it's worth a shot! Visit WonderBaby.org/articles/ipad-funding-special-needs for a list of grants to apply to.



Local charities are often very happy to help children in their community. Contacting nearby charities can be difficult (first you have to figure out which organizations are in your area and then figure out how to contact them), but often they are more receptive than the big national organizations.

Another option is to just try to raise the money yourself. Honestly, an iPad isn't that expensive, right? If you figure that you'll need at least \$500 for the iPad and maybe another \$250 for a protective cover and apps (depending on what you'll be using the iPad for), that's still well under \$1000. How many donations would you realistically need to reach your goal? Between friends, family and a few charitable strangers you could be there in no time! iPads have become one of the most requested items of Salinas Circle for Children over the
